By making it easier to find businesses and organizations that offer zero waste alternatives, this guide will help Yukoners to implement more sustainable ways of consuming and appreciate the idea that used materials are a resource as opposed to a waste.

In fall 2023 Lumel began to accept recycled glass to use in a new glass kiln, called the Phoenix, purchased by Raven ReCentre. With the new kiln, Lumel can create beautiful forms with glass that otherwise would head to the landfill.

Gather is a restaurant attached to Lumel Studios run by Lu and Mel's Daughter, Shanta and her husband John. All of the glassware, coffee mugs and dishware are hand made in Lumel's glass blowing studio or sourced by local artists. Glassware that is damaged in the restaurant is reused in the glass blowing studio and made into new glassware for the restaurant or art to be sold in the gallery. There is a hydroponics garden to provide fresh greens for Gather Cafe. Every year they also invite people to come and collect the herbs from their community garden before the plants freeze.

Electronic waste is not garbage because it often contains hazardous toxins that can leach into the environment causing ground water and air pollution. Sometimes reusing old electronics is possible, but other times the only option left is to recycle.

CFSY is managed by the Raven ReCentre, which runs the public computer drop off and e-waste fee collection on their behalf. Businesses that have larger quantities or security concerns can call or email to make an appointment to deliver computers right to the warehouse.



The Zero Waste Hierarchy

The Waste Hierarchy displays a progression of actions to support the Zero Waste system, from the most desirable (lowest environmental impact) to least desirable (higher environmental impact) use of materials.

Raven ReCentre is part of a larger waste management system and we are guided by the Waste Hierarchy which helps us to make the most responsible choices for the use and management of materials that come through our facility. We also use it to inspire Zero Waste programming that promotes sustainable actions and use of materials. Raven ReCentre's operations are focused on the top 4 actions in the hierarchy.



Zero Waste & the Circular Economy

Zero Waste practices conserve resources through responsible production, consumption and reuse, as well as recovery of all products, packaging and materials without incineration and without pollution to land, water or air.

The Circular Economy is a system where materials never become waste and nature is regenerated. It focuses on creating an economy that is not harmful to the environment or people. It means decoupling economic activity from the consumption of finite resources and designing waste out of the system.

Principles of the Circular Economy:

I. Design out Waste and Pollution

Waste and pollution are a result of decisions made at the design stage, where about 80% of environmental impacts are determined. By viewing waste as a design flaw we can ensure that waste and pollution are not created in the first place.

2. Keep Products and Materials In Use

We can design products and components so they can be reused, repaired, and remanufactured. When it comes to products like food or packaging, we should be able to get the materials back so they don't end up in landfill.

3. Regenerate Natural Systems

In nature, there is no concept of waste. By returning valuable nutrients to the soil and other ecosystems, we can enhance our natural resources.

At Raven ReCentre we see the Circular Economy as our bird's eye view of the economic system. Zero Waste is part of how we get to a Circular Economy. You can think of Zero Waste as the individual action and Circular Economy as the system wide change!
